


Tips for Using the new AquaBrowser Online Catalog

Relevancy And Other Ranking Options:

Search results are ranked based on their relevancy of your request but you can choose to sort your search by relevance, year, title and author.

1. **Relevance** ranking is the default, and is the best option for most searches because it looks at all parts of the record before bringing back the result list. Most online search engines (like those used at Amazon.com and Target.com) use this ranking method.
2. **Year** ranking gives you the most recently published works first.
3. **Title** organizes your search results alphabetically by title, starting with numbers.
4. **Author** ranking organizes your results alphabetically by author's last name.
